WHAT DO YOU have against New York, Sly?

Sylvester Stallone doesn't want to come to the city to answer an opposing attorney's questions in a copyright infringement case involving his now defunct Sly magazine.

"It sounds like Mr. Stallone doesn't want to get in the ring again," said attorney John Bostany, who represents the owners of a "shoe fetish" Web site called Sly.

He filed a \$1 million lawsuit against Stallone claiming copyright infringement.

Yesterday, Manhattan Federal Judge Richard Casey gave lawyers for both sides until Tuesday to sort out whether Stallone's attorneys should have to give up the actor's home address in California.

At issue is whether the subpoena should have been requested through a California court.

The last issue of Sly magazine, a lifestyle and fitness magazine for men over 40, hit the newsstands in December.
